How we look after your data.

We process information relevant to the above reasons/purposes. This may include:
□ personal details
□ business activities of the person whose personal information we are processing
☐ training details
□ education and employment details
We also process sensitive classes of information that may include:
□ physical or mental health details
□ racial or ethnic origin
Who the information is processed about
We process personal information about:
□ customers
□ clients
students
□ trainers
□ employees
□ professional advisers and consultants
□ complainants, enquirers
Who the information may be shared with
We sometimes need to share the personal information we process with the
individual themself and also with other organisations. Where this is necessary we
are required to comply with all aspects of the Data Protection Act (DPA). What
follows is a description of the types of organisations we may need to share some of
the personal information we process with for one or more reasons.
Where necessary or required we share information with:
□ business associates and other professional advisers
□ educators and examining bodies
□ current, past or prospective employers
☐ family, associates and representatives of the person whose personal data we
are processing
□ employment and recruitment agencies
□ suppliers and service providers;
□ persons making an enquiry or complaint
□ other companies in the same group
Trading and sharing personal information
Personal information is traded and shared as a primary business function. For this
reason the information processed may include name, contact details, family details,
financial details, employment details, and goods and services. This information may
be about customers and clients. The information may be traded or shared with
business associates and professional advisers, agents, service providers, customers
and clients, and traders in personal data.
